

An Open Letter to President Ilham Aliyev The Architect of the New Geopolitical Reality in the South Caucasus and Grandmaster of Energy Diplomacy

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Mr. President,

I am writing these lines while mentally looking at the panorama of Baku from the Highland Park, where the futuristic Flame Towers pierce the Caspian sky above the ancient walls of Icherisheher. This contrast is a perfect metaphor for your rule. You inherited a complex legacy from your great father, Heydar Aliyev, and today, in 2026, you govern a sovereign regional power that dictates its own terms, redraws Eurasian transport maps, and makes Brussels and Washington queue up for your energy resources.

You accomplished what seemed impossible three decades ago—fully restoring Azerbaijan's territorial integrity, carving your name into the country's history as a victorious leader. But great victories bring monumental responsibility. Today, you face

an even larger challenge: transforming military triumph into an irreversible historical triumph of institutional modernization.

As an objective, pragmatic analyst, it is clear that your chessboard in 2026 has become much more complex, and the stakes are higher than ever:

The Dilemma of the "Great Return" and the Peace Treaty: You have recovered Karabakh and Eastern Zangezur, and massive state billions are now being poured into these areas. But as a pragmatist, you know well that physical crude oil production at older Caspian fields is steadily declining. Natural gas compensates for this drop for now, but the hydrocarbon era is finite. While non-oil GDP growth is accelerating (projected at 3.7% this year), the private sector and small businesses remain sluggish, constrained by large state-owned monopolies.

The Caspian Balance in an Era of Storms: You are a recognized master of geopolitical balancing. You manage to sustain a deep strategic alliance with Türkiye, maintain a pragmatic dialogue with Russia, deepen energy and technological partnerships with the EU, and simultaneously drive integration within the Organization of Turkic States. However, holding this balance when the world is splitting into rigid blocs is becoming increasingly difficult. Any slight tilt toward one power center immediately creates risks for the sovereignty you so fiercely protect.

Institutional Quality and the Transition of Trust: Azerbaijani society remains deeply consolidated around your leadership following the national triumph. However, as the initial emotional wave of victory settles, domestic citizen demands are moving to the

forefront: social equity, tackling inflation (which is hovering around 5.7-6% due to food imports), judicial transparency, and reducing bureaucratic pressure on the economy. The governance modernization you initiated through the system of presidential special representatives needs to become deeply systemic. A strong nation requires not just a powerful military, but resilient, agile, and modern institutions.

Mr. President, you have proven that you know how to wait, calculate timing, and deliver precise strikes—both on the battlefield and at the negotiating table. You have brought Azerbaijan into the major leagues of regional politics.

But the true greatness of a nation is measured by how stable it remains when the era of easy hydrocarbon revenue ends. Use today's financial abundance and historic political capital to demonopolize the economy, unleash private enterprise, and build an Azerbaijan that is strong not just because of its soil and military, but due to its human capital, innovation, and flawless institutional foundations.
