

A Letter to the President

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To His Excellency Rodrigo Paz Pereira

President of the Plurinational State of Bolivia

Palacio Quemado, La Paz

Mr. President,

I am writing this at a moment when the heart of Bolivia beats with painful tension. Today, as our roads are blocked and store shelves empty, every Bolivian feels the weight of the choice facing our nation. You came to power as a symbol of change, a voice promising a new path, but today that path has become narrow and dangerous.

We are not blind. We see you making personal sacrifices by cutting state expenditures, a gesture that speaks to your desire to share the burden with the people. However, Mr. President, symbolic gestures are no longer enough. The country is choking, not from a lack of goodwill, but from a lack of bread, fuel, and certainty. Mr. President, history will not judge you by the number of political battles won, but by whether you managed to hold Bolivia back from the abyss in its darkest hour. Time is running out. Extend a hand, set aside pride, and become the unifier our nation so desperately needs.
