

Open Letter to President Joseph Nyuma Boakai

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To His Excellency Joseph Nyuma Boakai

President of the Republic of Liberia

Executive Mansion, Monrovia

Your Excellency,

Writing to you as a citizen who holds the future of this nation in my heart, I must address the reality we face in June 2026. The optimism that followed your inauguration is currently colliding with a harsh domestic environment.

Our country is trapped in a paradox: we possess fertile land, yet we import the rice that feeds our people. Our streets in Monrovia are filled with energetic youth, yet they are forced to spend their lives as "pen-pen" drivers because there is no formal sector to absorb them. The cost of living is rising, and for the average family, basic survival is becoming a daily struggle against inflation.

The greatest challenge you face is not merely economic—it is a crisis of trust. Corruption remains the silent parasite that drains our public services of their vitality. Citizens are watching closely to see if your "ARREST" agenda will transform from a slogan into tangible results—specifically, functional roads that connect our interior, reliable electricity, and a judicial system that holds the powerful accountable.

We hope you will be the statesman who finally breaks the cycle of patronage. We need a radical shift in agricultural policy to achieve self-sufficiency and an aggressive stance on public sector transparency. Do not let this mandate slip away; the people still have a sliver of hope that you can turn this ship of state toward a future of genuine dignity.
