Your Right Honourable,

Writing to you as a citizen deeply invested in the future of our island nation, I address the state of affairs as we navigate June 2026. Our people are currently living under the weight of high costs. While our GDP growth is steady, the everyday Mauritian is struggling with the inflation of imported goods, energy prices, and the housing crisis. There is a palpable concern that the economic

model has become exclusionary, favoring corporate interests while the middle class and our youth face stagnant wages and limited opportunities.

Furthermore, we are deeply concerned about the restoration of institutional trust. We look to your government to ensure that public procurement is transparent and that our regulators operate with absolute independence. The hope we vest in you is that you will break away from the patterns of political patronage that have shadowed our discourse in recent years. We need a structural renewal that prioritizes the dignity and economic security of every family.
