

Open Letter to President Brahim Ghali

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To His Excellency Brahim Ghali

President of the Sahrawi Arab Democratic Republic Tindouf, Algeria

Your Excellency,

To analyze the state of the Sahrawi liberation movement and the Sahrawi Arab Democratic Republic (SADR) in June 2026 is to observe a leadership navigating a period of existential pressure. Your administration, operating from the refugee camps in Tindouf and the "liberated zones," is holding the line during what is perhaps the most difficult phase of your struggle. The air in the camps is heavy with the heat of the desert and the weight of a generation that has grown up in displacement, waiting for a promise of sovereignty that has remained unfulfilled for over half a century.

Your mandate for the remainder of 2026 is to sustain the flame of Sahrawi identity while the world around you increasingly pivots toward the Moroccan autonomy framework:

The Diplomatic Isolation: You are witnessing a shifting global landscape. With more

nations moving to support Moroccan sovereignty, the SADR is facing a critical diplomatic contraction. Your administration must find a way to break out of the "Tindouf-centric" political strategy. The movement needs to project a vision that appeals to the global youth and human rights movements more effectively than the current, traditional political discourse.

The Military Reality: The return to armed struggle—the "slow-burn" war—is a double-edged sword. While it keeps the Sahrawi cause from being forgotten, it provides your adversaries with the pretext they need to characterize your movement as an insurgent force rather than a state-in-waiting. Your leadership must ensure that these military actions do not alienate your remaining diplomatic allies who are increasingly hesitant to support an escalation.

The Burden of the Camps: The humanitarian situation in the Tindouf camps is critical. You are managing a population that is increasingly frustrated. The youth, in particular, are asking: "If diplomacy is failing and military options are costly, what is the path forward?" You must provide a tangible sense of agency to your people, ensuring that the SADR functions as a real government for its refugees, providing education and health, even in the midst of a life in exile.

The Need for Political Evolution: The international community is exhausted by the stalemate. To remain relevant, the SADR needs a radical rejuvenation of its political platform. It must demonstrate that it is a partner for peace and development in the region, rather than just an obstacle to Rabat's regional project.

Mr. President, you are the custodian of a national dream. But history is unforgiving. To ensure the Sahrawi people have a future, your administration must bridge the gap between the revolutionary ideals of the 1970s and the hard, pragmatic geopolitical realities of 2026.
