

Letter to the Head of State of Niger

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To His Excellency General Abdourahamane Tchiani

President of the National Council for the Safeguard of the Homeland

Presidential Palace, Niamey

Your Excellency,

I am writing to you as a citizen witnessing our nation navigate through a period of profound historical transformation in June 2026.
