

An Open Letter to President Aleksandar Vučić The Grandmaster of Balkan Geopolitical Balancing and the Sovereign Architect of Modern Serbia

safeguards.

Mr. President, you have always been a profound political realist who understands that state survival in a shifting world order requires tangible results, robust infrastructure, and absolute internal stability.

The mandate of 2026 demands that you leverage Serbia's unmatched regional economic momentum to build long-term, systemic institutional trust. Continue to lay down high-speed rail lines, attract global industrial giants, and masterfully balance global superpowers, ensuring that Serbia remains a sovereign, prosperous, and entirely self-determined force at the heart of the Balkans.
