

Open Letter to President Donald Trump

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Dear President Trump,

I am writing not as a supporter or an opponent, but as an observer interested in how political leaders use the power entrusted to them.

More than a year has passed since the beginning of your term as the 47th President of the United States. This period has already been sufficient to identify several characteristics that distinguish your presidency.

One of your most visible strengths is determination. Few political leaders are willing to pursue their agenda as persistently in the face of criticism from political opponents, media organizations, foreign governments, and even parts of their own establishment. Whether one agrees with your policies or not, it is difficult to deny that you have demonstrated a willingness to act rather than merely comment.

Internationally, your administration has pursued a more transactional approach to alliances and foreign policy. Some view this as realism and a defense of national interests. Others see risks in weakening long-established partnerships. History will ultimately judge whether these changes strengthened or diminished America's global position.

Your presidency has also raised broader questions about the relationship between political leadership, public institutions, media influence, and public trust. These questions will likely remain important long after your term has ended.

If I were to summarize this first period of your presidency in a single sentence, it would be this:

You have proven highly effective at changing the direction of political debate, but it remains uncertain whether changing the debate will ultimately prove easier than uniting the nation around the changes you seek.

Whatever judgments history eventually reaches, your presidency will almost certainly be remembered as one of the most consequential and closely examined periods in modern American politics.
