

## An Open Letter to Prime Minister Andrej Plenković The Technocratic Anchor of Zagreb and the Longest- Serving Leader in the European Union

Prove that your decade at the helm has not been about the preservation of power, but about the permanent modernization of the sovereign Croatian state.
