

A Letter to the President

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To His Excellency Cyril Ramaphosa

President of the Republic of South Africa

We need to stabilize our energy, secure our streets, and build an economy where a small business owner in Soweto can thrive just as easily as a corporate giant in Sandton. Give us a South Africa where merit, not connections, decides your success. Give us the stability we need to rebuild our pride.

Mr. President, the Rainbow Nation is waiting for the colors to shine equally for everyone. Are you ready to make that happen?
