

An Open Letter to the Secretary of State of the Holy See, Cardinal Pietro Parolin The Supreme Diplomat of the Vatican, Guardian of Curial Balance, and Architect of Global Dialogue in an Era of Fractured Geopolitics

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Your Eminence,

To observe your tenure as Secretary of State behind the tightly guarded velvet curtains of the Apostolic Palace is to witness the most sophisticated, patient, and long-term diplomacy on Earth.
