

An Open Letter to Prime Minister Xanana Gusmão The Maverick Liberator of Dili and the Architect of the Timor-Leste Sovereign Ascent

With older fields fully depleted, your fiscal teams must rapidly diversify into high-value organic agriculture (specifically expanding premium Timor coffee exports), sustainable marine fisheries, and eco-tourism along the pristine coasts of Atauro Island, turning short-term oil wealth into permanent economic infrastructure.

Confronting the Youth Demographic Tidal Wave: Over 60% of your population is under the age of 25. While this represents immense national vitality, a lack of structural employment outside the state sector creates a volatile socio-economic landscape. Your administration must shift from post-conflict veteran pension disbursements toward massive investments in vocational training, digital literacy, and English/Portuguese language mastery to integrate your youth into the global economy.

Mr. Prime Minister, you successfully led your people through the jungles to win their freedom; now you must lead them through the complex corridors of global finance

and regional trade.

The mandate of your current tenure is to prove that Timor-Leste can convert its hard-won political sovereignty into permanent economic independence. By unlocking Greater Sunrise on your own terms, successfully cementing full ASEAN membership, and building a transparent, resilient non-oil economy, you will secure an unassailable historical legacy—transforming a nation born of struggle into a prosperous, self-sustaining anchor of the Indo-Pacific.
