Dear Kristrún,

Overtourism fatigue: The influx of tourists is several times larger than Iceland's entire population. Yes, they bring in foreign currency, but our fragile Arctic environment is being trampled, café prices are geared toward Americans, and Reykjavík is losing its unique atmosphere, turning into one giant Airbnb. It is time to introduce strict environmental taxes and quotas. We need high-quality, high-value, and regulated tourism that doesn't destroy the lives of locals.

Preserving Icelandic identity: Amidst a labor shortage, the number of expatriates and migrant workers on the island has surged. We welcome guests, but our unique culture—and a language that has remained virtually unchanged since the Viking Age—are beginning to fade under the pressure of global English. We need robust, effective integration programs and support for the Icelandic language in the digital sphere and the business world; otherwise, within a couple of generations, we will lose what makes us Icelandic.

Kristrún, you have proven that age is no barrier to leadership. You have everything going for you: the trust of the Icelandic people, a strong coalition, and an analytical mind.

Do not be afraid to take a tougher stance with big business and fishing magnates for

the sake of ordinary citizens. We do not want a government that acts merely as an "efficient crisis management committee." We want to see bold social reforms that protect Iceland from both subterranean fire and market injustice.
