

A Letter to the Prime Minister

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To Prime Minister Alix Didier Fils-Aimé

Office of the Prime Minister, Port-au-Prince, Haiti

Mr. Prime Minister,

I write to you today from a land that feels like it is holding its breath, waiting for a dawn that seems perpetually delayed. Haiti stands at a precipice, and the weight of this moment rests squarely on your shoulders. With the dissolution of the Presidential Council, the mantle of governance is yours alone. You have inherited a nation where the sound of gunfire often drowns out the voices of the suffering, and where the hope for a stable future is being tested daily by the sheer scale of the violence.

We are a nation of 11 million, but today, we are a nation fragmented. From the streets of Port-au-Prince, where gang control has become the grim reality of daily life, to the corners of the countryside that were once safe havens and are now under siege, our people are living in a state of constant fear. Nearly 1.5 million of our brothers and sisters are displaced, forced from their homes not by disaster, but by the malice of armed groups. medicine, and when even the most sacred community spaces are turned into emergency shelters, we are no longer just facing a crisis—we are facing an existential struggle for our very soul.

Mr. Prime Minister, your promise to establish security and organize elections is a necessary vision, but the people need to see it in action. We do not need more promises from the halls of power; we need the streets to be reclaimed for the citizens. We need a government that acts not just as an administrator of chaos, but as a restorer of order. The arrival of international security support is a tool, but it is your administration that must provide the strategy and the legitimacy.

The world is watching, but it is we, the people of Haiti, who are living the tragedy. We are tired of the cycle of transition. We are tired of being a country in permanent emergency. We need a path that leads to the ballot box, but that path must be paved with the security of our families. Every day that passes without visible progress is a day that more lives are lost and more dreams are shattered.

You have the opportunity to be the leader who finally breaks the cycle. This is not about political survival; it is about national survival. Restore our safety, feed our vulnerable, and give us back our streets. We are a people of immense pride and resilience, but even the strongest spirit needs a foundation to stand upon. Build that foundation for us, before the opportunity is lost to history.

Haiti is in a state of functional collapse. The governance mandate for the remainder of 2026 is strictly operational: reclaim territory from armed groups, stabilize supply chains, and organize credible elections by the end of the year to restore a semblance of constitutional legitimacy.

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
